


FY 2016 USAID BUDGET


- * FY 2004 = US\$10.2 bn.

- * FY 2015 = US\$20.1

- USAID's Twitter app to Cuban cell phones: ZunZuneo
- * USAID Hip-Hop project: infiltrate Cuba's underground hip-hop movement to spark a youth movement against the govt.
- USAID (Creative Associates International) hired "apathetic" young people from Venezuela, Costa Rica and Peru as tourists but as agents of the US
- USAID US\$11 million to fund internal/external groups to infiltrate and influence trade
